

School Groups

Kindergarten – Sensory Awareness Walk

Students will have a 20-minute classroom component in the Nature Center, where the students can taste honey, molasses, smell different "mystery" scents and see if they identify the smells come from, they will see and touch bird feathers and different animal bones. The students will be led on a 1/2-mile hike on the Birdberry Trail, and experience the hike using different senses (hearing different bird calls, smelling different fragrant plants, touching different kinds of bark). **(SKCS1)**

1st Grade – Plant and Animal Discovery Walk

On this investigative 1-mile ranger-led walk on the Birdberry Trail, students will about the basic needs of plants and animals. Students will also identify different parts of plants, from tall trees to small grasses. Students will also look for wildlife, or signs of wildlife, and compare animals and what their needs are. Students and teachers are encouraged to bring journals and/or digital cameras to record their findings. **(S1L1)**

2nd and 4th Grade – Early Georgians and Ft. Yargo

Join a Park Ranger and historic re-enactors and learn what life was like for early Georgia Pioneers. Learn about the Native Americans who lived in the area, and why settlers built forts like Ft. Yargo. Learn about what resources the pioneers and Native Americans used to survive, including what they ate, the clothes they wore, what challenges they faced as early pioneers, and how the Native Americans philosophies toward the new pioneers were forged. **(SS2H2) (SS4H2a)**

High School – Art in the Park

Students will use a sketchbook and make several thumbnail sketches on the Birdberry Nature Trail. On the second part of the field trip, the students will take the sketches and use them to create a larger work. This can be done in Pencil or Acrylic paint. Students can use what they know about color theory (hue, value, and intensity and monochromatic, analogous, complimentary, split complimentary, and triadic colors) in their larger work. (VAHSVAPR, VAHSVAPR.3) Other program themes available -

Birdwalks – ID birds by sight and sound in different habitats on the park.

Dragonfly and Damselfly Hikes – Identification of Dragonflies, damselflies, and the habitats they use.

Butterfly walks (Seasonal) – ID butterflies, habitats, host and nectar plants.

Archery – Introduction based on National Archery in Schools Program principles.

5. We require 1 adult for every 15 students/youth. It is the responsibility of the adults with your group to ensure discipline.
